World Small Animal Veterinary Association 2010 Guidelines: Vaccination Update - July 2010*

The recently revised World Small Animal Veterinary Association (WSAVA) 2010 Guidelines for the Vaccination of Dogs and Cats define core vaccines as those "which ALL dogs and cats, regardless of circumstances, should receive. Core vaccines protect animals from severe, life- threatening diseases which have global distribution."

Core vaccines for dogs are those that protect from canine distemper virus (CDV), canine adenovirus (CAV) and canine parvovirus (CPV). The WSAVA 2010 Guidelines Fact Sheets note that the modified live virus (MLV) core vaccines for dogs have a demonstrated duration of immunity of nine years or longer.

Veterinary immunology experts advise that vaccination for the serious viral diseases is only necessary for puppies, (with the final puppy vaccination around 14-16 weeks). Duration of immunity.....

A BEARDIE MINUTE by Mike Tupa

August 2010

Over the past month a lot of different topics have wondered through my head about what to share about my Beardies, what they mean in my life, and what I am to them.

Recently I came across a University study on "An integrative and functional framework for the study of animal emotion and mood" (Mendl, Burman, Paul, 2010) that attempted to do as the title implies. Those University folk say that they can address the emotions of our animals and describe how long term mood states arise from those short-term emotions and guide animal decision making. They hoped to measure animal emotion. The gist of the study was that animals have emotional states (surprise!), that those states drive response patterns (another surprise!) and that positive rewards (and emotional states) prove to produce positive mood states. But, the conclusion is that they cannot investigate directly with "biologically relevant and traceable phenomena and concepts." What did it say? Got me. But you can look it up at the Royal Society of Biological Sciences Proceedings, July 2010.

The only reason I've allocated a paragraph to this study is that it so often fits into the mold of how we all look at the work we do with our dogs. Training a dog to heel, fetch, stay, sit, be your companion etc. takes time and is not an objective quantifiable journey. Books are good, trainers and classes certainly help, but nothing works better than spending time with your dog. There is no formula, 12 Step Method, Alpha Dog, or No Down Payment Plan for training a dog. You have to know the dog; I mean really know him, before you two can get the responses you need. I watched a "street person" (some would say "homeless") walking the highway last week. Without a leash, verbal commands, treats or punishment his dog was following, heeling, keeping in step, responsive to his human, and when the person sat by the corner with his "need a job" cardboard sign his dog dropped next to him and promptly fell asleep. Certainly a dog well trained.

Some would say, "Poor Dog" but in truth that dog was behaving as we all hope our dogs will behave. Love of his human, attention to details, responsive to needs, maybe offer a bit of protection when needed, and a good nap when his human sits down. There is no judgment about cloths, life style, economic situation, where they will spend the night, etc. Just love and responsiveness to his human. While certainly a life of difficulties it is a life shared and one with its little rewards for both the "street person" and his dog. (make a note: carry extra bottles of water for the homeless and their dogs)

After all these years with Beardies I've come to realize that we dog owners already know what the RSBSP study took months to assemble and volumes to say. We know our pets have emotions and that those emotions determine responses. We quantify our knowledge with the results we experience each day. And, we know what they didn't study; that our Beardies create an emotional response in us, train us, teach us to be attentive, aware, and loving.

In my own way of thinking, Beardies are in some ways unique. They are very vocal about what they need, what they want, and they know how to ask for it. While not able to talk they are able to communicate their desires and wait for us to respond. They each study our response to a bark, or a lick, or a brush the side of the leg, or waiting at the door, or placing a ball at our feet, or at the dinner table's edge, or hopping on the bed, etc. And when we give them the correct response we humans get a positive response from our Beardies. They are teaching us.!.

And they do all this without the direction of a Royal Society journal published thesis.
