RMBCC Board Meeting Minutes – August 28, 2021

Zoom meeting commenced at 5:00 PM.

Treasurer's report:

Balance: \$8380.02. Expenditures: \$200 for grooming video production \$150 for the specialty ad. It was supposed to be in color, but was printed in black and white.

RMBCC Website: Nan Matthews will manage the website, and Karen Norteman will continue as webmaster. Nan will make updates.

Membership: Meg Naylor sent the final notice on August 27, 2021. Several longtime members did not renew. Total membership is in the high 30's. Some members sent additional money, one even sending an extra \$100.

Bearded Collie Club Picnic: The picnic occurred on August 29 at Dekoevend Park in

Centennial, with approximately 25 members attending. The box lunches we purchased from Jimmy Johns were a success. Total cost: \$317.30, which included a \$30 tip. New Business:


Paisley and Dakota enjoyed the 2021 Specialty in Olympic, WA! We came home with lots of beautiful trophies and sparkly ribbons.

Dear Fetch,

That is a very handy task! I'll bet when you were a pup, your people taught you to play ball by rewarding you when you retrieved the ball. Maybe you scored another treat when you gave the ball to your people. That task and reward method can be used to teach your sister this desired activity.

Tell your people to place an item on the floor. Teach sister to touch it; get a treat, repeat till she has learned the routine. Next teach sister to pick up the item, treat, repeat until she learns it. Next teach sister to bring/give the item to Gramma or whomever playing this game with her. This may take a while, but Beardies like to make their owners happy so lots of praise should encourage this activity. If your Gramma spends time in her chair reading or watching TV, Gramma can work with your sister to perfect this handy little service. The game becomes more fun when your people teach sister to bring the item to another person also.

This "pick up and bring it" becomes a game of combined skills, but mostly it is a fun game of "will work for treats." Have fun!

Beardie Minute

A look back at how RMBCC began...... by Mike Tupa Fall, 2021

Well, the trees are turning, nights are getting cooler and days shorter. My consumption of coffee has increased, and the shorter days mean I sit around more than just a couple months ago. My Beardie, Abbey, might also recognize the change in seasons. She works by the sun until we shift our routine then she shifts with us. We may eat at the same time but there's no outside dinner and we head to bed a bit earlier. I guess we all are diurnal creatures ruled by the daylight and darkness. Ready for bed now at 7 but not at 10-11 as earlier in the year. So now sitting on the back deck, the yellows of my ash, redbud, and maple all blending to produce a kick back soaking up the last warmth of the late afternoon sunshine dream. My favorite time of the year. Cool air, warm sun, colors abound and a dog nose wondering if I'm napping or just internalizing. But I have a Beardie Minute to produce and now I must get up and focus elsewhere. Expect a pretty scattered article this time (aren't they all).

I was thinking how RMBCC began, what was important back then and how active were those early club folks in getting this movement going. I was thinking how interesting it was to see how a few (4-5) Beardie owners got together over a couple beers and agreed to join their Beardie knowledge and obsession to form what is now a thriving club. Now, I'm not sure if I can recount the specific dates, people, activities, etc. but I can share some of my thoughts on what we did and what was good back then. I know it was back in the pre-technical age. Cell phones barely were part of our livelihood and computers (word processing) was kept to those special supervisors (via a secretary) to use. Social distancing was as far as the coiled handset could reach from the phone and a long-distance call was still something only used after 7pm.

But back in the early '90s (?) Beardie geeks gathered at dog shows, shared cookies, and thought of ways to improve care for our dogs, what grooming tips and shampoos we use, training, puppies coming up, and how can we have fun other than in the dog show grooming areas. An example we thought we could follow from the national Bearded Collie Club (of America) would formalize the association, provide a place to retain dues so we could bring in speakers, etc. and provide refreshments for meetings. Our informal became a formal dog breed club, the Rocky Mountain Bearded Collie Connection, RMBCC, our pride and joy. Meetings were critical at that time. None of us were connected nor were we in the same community. Spread north and south along the Colorado Front Range and even into Arizona we had to have an annual meeting-picnic and Holiday party.

We had to have someone (committee) to schedule education at those meetings (talks, grooming, herding, grooming, showing, diseases, and of course grooming). Meetings were a pretty religious event held almost monthly (I was a president for a year or two at that time) and the committees were expected to produce fun informative and topical events for everyone. It was outrageously demanding, maybe foolishly demanding, but few of us had any knowledge to offer. Those who were in the breed for many years seemingly kept away from us young ones. But we learned, we grew RMBCC, held national dog shows (without ever knowing what the heck we were doing). And in that growth, we have held several of those dog shows, coupled with other breed clubs hosted all breed herding and confirmation events. Over several years we even manned display tables at local Festivals and at the local shopping mall Dog Display days... such fun.

It often seems that so little is happening within RMBCC today. But members (now close to 40) are active on-line, over the web pages, email, Face Fook, YouTube and more. Our meetings are clustered around topics that begin with "did you see Meg on YouTube" or "lost Beardie" postings on our club web page. More recently a full series on grooming Beardie videos was produced for RMBCC and posted on YouTube. Amazing times. And all the while we are showing our dogs,



expanding into obedience, rally and herding. As a RMBCC member life is good, our dogs are appreciated, and we are better educated.

Oh, did I mention the newsletter transformation. Yes, those early days the Beardie Works was typed and pasted into something that could be copied. We were just beyond the age of mimeograph reproduction but not far. That evolved into short, assembled handouts and mailings, produced on the now old Apple Mac and Radio Shack computers. A laborious task that was printed and mailed. Now it's all easy-peasey assembled and posted on the web. Club meetings include annual picnics, dog romps in the park, herding events, and "social" gatherings at multi breed events. Even with the 2020 blackout we've kept it rolling and fun.

The goals are the same. How do we learn more about our breed, teach more, have more fun, and provide outreach to the community when it's needed? Spread from Cheyenne to Albuquerque and into the mountains RMBCC is recognized nationally as a club that offers a valuable contribution to the Beardie world. And it all started over a couple beers.
