We thought some of the club members would be interest in the newest performance sport from AKC – Fast Coursing Agility Test (FastCAT).. It is a timed straight 100-yard dash for dogs. Dogs are held behind the start line, and the coursing lure is activated prompting the dog to follow, chasing it to the finish line and into a catch pen. It requires no "training," and several club members think it is great fun for them and their dog.

If you have a portable tent or awning, please bring it for shade. You may want to bring chairs, blankets for your own comfort and seating in the ballpark.


### **Directions**

### **Bearded Collie Club of America Herding Instinct Test**

Sponsored by Rocky Mountain Bearded Collie Connection

### May 26, 2023

The instinct test will find out if your Beardie has the instinct to herd sheep. Dogs need to be 6 months or older. No training is necessary to participate. This is not an AKC title but is recognized by the Bearded Collie Club of America. A certificate and ribbon will be awarded for each dog that passes. Our judge is Carrie Sparks, of Elizabeth, CO, and the event will be at her place, Hachita Farms. The day will begin at 8:30 AM and we will probably be finished by 11:00 - 12:00. We will allow approximately 15 minutes for each run. I will put together a schedule – let me know if you have a desired time to run. Also, be sure to arrive in plenty of time for your test.

**What to bring besides yourself and your dog** – a chair, proper clothing for the weather, water & poop bags for your dog, The club will provide human bottled water and there is a port-a-potty available.

#### Directions to the Trial Site: You may want to use your navigation system.

Hachita Farms 4500 Private Rd 162

(2nd house on the left, white w/ black trim)

#### Parking on road. You should exercise your dog on leash in this area, outside of the fence.

#### From Castle Rock/CO Springs:

Take Hwy 86 through Franktown and through the town of Elizabeth. At the top of the hill, turn left/north on County Rd 21. Go north on CR 21 for 5.7 miles to Private Rd 162. Turn left/west on PR 162 (dirt road)

### From Parker:

Parker Road/Hwy 83 to Hess Rd. Left/east on Hess Rd – will turn into Hilltop after about a mile – stay on for another 4-5 miles to Singing Hills (can only turn left/east again). Stay on Singing Hills east for approx. 7 miles (past 2 four-way stops) to County Rd 21 (First right after the second four-way stop). Right/south at CR21. Go 1 mile south to Private Rd 162. Turn right/west on PR 162 (dirt road).

### From Fort Collins:

I-25 South to Denver & follow From Parker directions. Alternate – take E-470 requiring tolls & follow your navigation system.



### Aunt Beardie



Dear Aunt Beardie,

My younger sister, Trixie hates to have her nails trimmed. She squirms around, pulls her foot back, and makes it really impossible for my people to trim her claws. How can I help? Sincerely, Flower

Dear Flower,

Oh, those Beardie kids do have touchy toes! When my little ones were conditioned from puppy hood to tolerate work on their feet, nail trims worked well. Such conditioning can be started anytime. Communicate to your people that they must build up Trixie's tolerance for gently touching, playing with, and holding her paws to begin. Your people might offer treats when they touch her toes. Once Trixie allows toe touching, your people can hold her foot for a short time then work toward longer timeframes. Getting treats during paw holding should eventually be interpreted by Trixie as "paw holding leads to treats or happy things." Or perhaps, like my little Rosita, she may prefer a favorite toy to mouth or chew during paw-holding.

By the time Trixie has been conditioned to accept paw handling for a significant time, your people can work toward very carefully clipping one claw and offering lots of treats or rewards for one claw. Eventually they can do more than one claw at a time. Experts recommend at first, to clip claws on just one paw each day, then play games or reward with toys or other favorite things. It takes time but eventually your people will succeed.

One reference that I read recommends that the clipper be kept nearby so Trixie gets used to it being there. Eventually when your people are able to trim her claws, it will seem to Trixie like everything is the same; no big deal, no reason to stress about it when the clipper appears. (A word of caution: It is important not to clip a claw too short to cause pain.) Your people might consider filing nails rather than clipping.

After almost a year, she let me know that Dulcie was available and with the best news of all was with Tammy Begler, a long time RMBCC member. Tammy and I talked and decided I could pick her up in Santa Fe in July, 2018. Dulcie and Tammy went to obedience classes and ran 6 miles/day with Tammy's pack losing more than 12 unwanted pounds.

She fit in perfectly with Bailey, my original Beardie, and during her time with me received a Rally Notice title in 2019 and CGCA in 2020. She was the most delightful little girl, and it was very hard to say goodbye earlier this year.

She was one of the last River babies – River being Jill Floberg's multi-champion boy, River.
