I have a couple of big brags for Paisley!

Paisley achieved her Rally Championship (RACH) in January. The requirements are 20 triple Q's (Master Q, Excellent Q, Advanced Q/trial) plus 150 points, with 75 of the points from the Master Class. We have been working towards this the last couple of years, and the RACH makes Paisley a dual Champion. She's the first Beardie Rally Champion in Colorado!

Paisley was also awarded BCCA's Master In Versatility award! This is the top award for versatility. To achieve this award, you need 2 Championships, a herding title, and 15 titles from at least 5 venues. Her Rally CH was the final title needed for her MV award.

Sorsha was the first Bearded Collie to receive a title from North American Canicross this March when she completed the requirements for the Novice Canicross Dog title.



North American Cancross (NACC) https://nacanicross.com was founded in June of 2019 for the purpose of promoting Canicross as a competitive sport in the United States.

Competitors may compete with any dog, purebred and/or mixed breed, 12 months or older. The goal of the sport is to demonstrate the competitor's skill and expertise in training and performance.

Canicross is meant to highlight the fundamental elements of a dog(s) and human running team: strength, confidence, speed, communication and all around athleticism. All who want to compete in the North American Canicross titling program must register a dog with NACC in order to enter the dog in the titling program and in future sanctioned events.

Bearded Collie Club of America Herding Instinct Test Sponsored by Rocky Mountain Bearded Collie Connection May 23, 2025

The instinct test will find out if your Beardie has the instinct to herd sheep. Dogs need to be 6 months or older. No training is necessary to participate. This is not an AKC title but is recognized by the Bearded Collie Club of America. A certificate and ribbon will be awarded for each dog that passes.

Our judge is Carrie Sparks, of Elizabeth, CO, and the event will be at her place, Hachita Farms. The day will begin at 8:30 AM, and we will probably be finished by 11:00 – 12:00. We will allow approximately 12 minutes for each run. I will put together a schedule – let me know if you have a desired time to run. Also, be sure to arrive in plenty of time for your test.

What to bring besides yourself and your dog – a chair, proper clothing for the weather, water & poop bags for your dog. There is a port-a-potty available.

Directions to the Trial Site: You may want to use your navigation system.

Hachita Farms
4500 Private Rd 162
Elizabeth, CO 80107
(2nd house on the left, white w/ black trim)

Parking on road. You should exercise your dog on leash in this area, outside of the fence.

From Castle Rock/CO Springs:

Take Hwy 86 through Franktown and through the town of Elizabeth. At the top of the hill, turn left/north on County Rd 21. Go north on CR 21 for 5.7 miles to Private Rd 162. Turn left/west on PR 162 (dirt road)

From Parker:

Parker Road/Hwy 83 to Hess Rd. Left/east on Hess Rd – will turn into Hilltop after about a mile – stay on for another 4-5 miles to Singing Hills (can only turn left/east again). Stay on Singing Hills east for approx. 7 miles (past 2 four-way stops) to County Rd 21 (First right after the second four-way stop). Right/south at CR21. Go 1 mile south to Private Rd 162. Turn right/west on PR 162 (dirt road).

From Fort Collins:

I-25 South to Denver & follow From Parker directions. Alternate – take E-470 requiring tolls & follow your navigation system.
